It is open to high school seniors or graduates pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited college or university, business, or trade school. Students must live within the service area of an Indiana County Fire Department.

Eligible applicants must have lettered in two high school sports, display a strong work ethic on and off the field, demonstrate teamwork, loyalty, and selflessness when dealing with others, and have a GPA of 3.2 or higher.	

Larry R. Mastrine Memorial Scholarship	Maximum award amount of \$30,000 to be paid out over four years	Dr. Larry Mastrine was a competent, dedicated, and well-loved physician in his community for over 40 years. He believed in the value of education and hard work, and he treated his patients and everyone he knew with kindness. Dr. Mastrine grew up in the small town of Colver, studied in Pittsburgh, and returned to raise his family in the community that was a source of pride for him. His patients became friends and he worked tirelessly to solve their medical issues and to encourage them during illness and tough times. Sadly, Dr. Mastrine passed away in January 2021. The Mastrine family, inspired by Dr. Mastrine's commitment to and impact on his community, has established a scholarship fund in Dr. Mastrine's memory that will allow local college eligible young adults with financial constraints an opportunity to complete college and begin satisfying careers.  This Larry R.
