Bailey Family Football Matters Scholarship	\$500	Provides scholarship support to a senior student who is currently enrolled in a Southern Alleghenies Football Coaches Association school and is a member of their high school football team.
Baskin Foundation Scholarship	Fund rep decides annually	The Baskin Foundation was designed to award scholarships for higher education to students who have attended a high school located in Indiana County and are planning to pursue a degree in nursing or physical education and have a demonstrated history of academic achievement. The foundation was created in 1996 in memory of Anna Mae Sweeny Baskin and Graham Sefton Baskin.
Elmer C. Laslo Memorial Scholarship	\$1,000	Provides scholarship support for students pursuing a business-related field at a post- secondary educational institution. Eligible applicants must attend a high school located within the 1st Summit Bank market area.
Indiana County Fire Chiefs Association Student Scholarship Award	2 @ \$500 each	This scholarship was created to recognize and support students for community service. It is open to high school seniors or graduates pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited college or university, business, or trade school. Collegiate freshman, sophomores, and juniors are eligible to apply, as well as non-traditional students who will be re-entering school in the upcoming semester. Students must live within the service area of an Indiana County Fire Department.
Mr. Jodon Educational Scholarship	\$500	Provides a scholarship for students in Bedford, Cambria, Indiana, Somerset, or Westmoreland counties who will be pursuing a post-secondary degree in education.
Scott A. Salser Memorial Scholarship	\$500	Provides an annual scholarship to a student who lives in Indiana County who is planning to study at the post-secondary level in fields related to music and vocal performance, including education.

Students pursuing an associate, diploma, or certificate degree are urged to apply. A few examples of technical degrees include computer technology, emergency medical technician, HVAC, industrial technology, and machining technology. Applicant must possess an overall GPA of 80+ ٠ Applicant must submit a one-page essay "My Career Goal." Be certain your essay includes your career goal, your reason for choosing this career, and what you have done to prepare for a career in this field. Applicant must complete the standard scholarship application. Glen George Memorial Scholarship Created to support a graduating senior at United School District who plans to pursue a \$500 career in the field of science, technology, or science education. Students must complete the standard scholarship application and submit a 1-2 paragraph essay describing their career goals. Recipient to be selected by the Glen George family members in conjunction with the school district scholarship committee. Hoover Family Scholarship To provide a scholarship to a United Basketball player. \$500

Aloi Scholarship	\$250	Created to provide scholarship(s) annually to graduating senior(s) at United School District who plan to either enter the police academy or pursue studies at a post- secondary educational institution with a major in law enforcement, criminal justice, forensics, or other related field.
		Students must complete the standard scholarship application and submit a 1-2 paragraph essay describing why they are choosing a career in law enforcement and what they hope to accomplish with it. Recipient to be selected by the Aloi family members in conjunction with the school district scholarship committee.
Laura Uadiski Wright Memorial Scholarship	\$1,000	Created to provide a \$1,000 scholarship to graduating seniors at United School District who are planning to pursue post-secondary education in a healthcare field.
		Students must complete standard application and submit an essay on why they are choosing a career in healthcare and what winning the scholarship would mean to them financially. Winner will be selected by committee chosen by fund representative.
McCully Scholarship	United School District will advise the Community Foundation if funds are available	Essay focused, student must write on how they've personally demonstrated resiliency.
Ric Szelong Memorial Scholarship	\$100	This award is open to any graduating senior at United School District who is entering an accredited four-year institution. In addition to completing United High School's standard application, applicants should also include an essay on the following topic: "How an educator has had a positive impact on my educational journey". The school district makes the award decisions.
Shawn Carota Football Scholarship	\$500	The purpose of this scholarship is to help a Senior football player from United High School with a scholarship to honor the memory and giving personality of Shawn.
