If no students meet this requirement, then the scholarship can be awarded to a student pursuing a different major, so long as the rest of the criteria are met.</li> <li>GPA of 3.3 or higher</li> <li>Participate in two or more varsity sports for a minimum of two years in each sport</li> <li>Display leadership abilities by being a captain or an officer in high school organizations</li> <li>Display teamwork, loyalty, and selflessness while being a member of a team</li> <li>Display strong work ethic in athletics and in the classroom</li> <li>Must have a letter of reference from one or more teachers or coaches.</li> </ul> |

Olivia walked into a room and the light came on. Her glow put the sun to shame. She was the first one to pick you up and make you smile when you were down. She was a champion of the underdog, she was good to people, funny, loyal, and more than anything she was kind. If you are joining the military, please provide documentation of your written service obligation.</li> </ul> |

| Carl and Anna Sherbine<br>Elementary Education<br>Scholarship | \$400 | <ul> <li>The recipient will be a Forest Hills High School senior pursuing a degree in elementary education. The selection committee has the option of awarding the scholarship to secondary education applicants, only if there are no applications by elementary prospects. The decision will be based on the following: <ul> <li>A written presentation by the applicant as to why they want to be an elementary teacher</li> <li>Class standing and a minimum of 1000 of SAT, 24 on ACT, and GPA of at least 3.0</li> <li>Involvement in extracurricular activities in and out of school</li> </ul> </li> <li>The selection will be made by Forest Hills administration and staff plus one member of the Sherbine family if convenient to all involved.</li> </ul>   |

| Claudia Mehall Memorial<br>Scholarship                        | \$500 | <ul> <li>Eligible to Forest Hills High School seniors who have a minimum 3.0 GPA and a strong history of community service and volunteer work. First preference is to award the scholarship to a student who will be majoring in the following fields that reflect the type of work that Claudia Mehall performed during her career at Forest Hills School District as the Supervisor of Special Education and School Psychologist: special education, psychology, social work, or a related field. If no students meet the field of study requirement, the scholarship should be awarded to the student whose community service and volunteer work most closely resemble the traits that Claudia displayed during her work: empathy, kindness, patience, and concern for others.</li> <li>Selection is done by the Forest Hills scholarship committee using their knowledge of the senior class. There is no application.</li> </ul> |
| Don Bailey Forest Hills Football<br>Boosters Scholarship      | \$500 | <ul> <li>Open to senior football team members at Forest Hills High School who meet the following criteria:</li> <li>GPA of 3.2 or higher</li> <li>Accepted to an accredited two- or four-year college or university</li> <li>Has a solid attendance record</li> <li>Has been an active team member for minimum of three years</li> <li>Has a strong history of community service</li> <li>Must be of strong character and leadership as evidenced by being an officer or captain of the football team or another school organization.</li> <li>School district selects the winner annually, along with football coaching staff.</li> </ul>  |



| Erin Hostetler Scholarship                            | \$12,700                         | <ul> <li>Seniors of Forest Hills High School who are in good academic standing</li> <li>Accepted to an accredited four-year institution majoring in a medical-related field or attending<br/>Penn State University with any major</li> <li>High Academic Achievement during all high school years</li> <li>Participation in school club and sports activities is an equal consideration. The ability to achieve<br/>academically and participate in outside activities is a sign of maturity</li> <li>Financial need is a consideration</li> </ul> |
